95-99 = Extremely good; 100 = Excellent

- Proper and articulate analysis of the issues
- Knowledge and use of authorities.
- Logic and reasoning.
- Ingenuity (able to argue by analogy from related aspects of humanitarian law)
- Clarity and organisation.
- Persuasiveness
